1. Refugees, Amenities, and the Skill Premium (Job Market Paper)

This paper examines the economic impacts of a large-scale migration using the case of Syrian refugee influx into Türkiye. I first provide evidence showing reduced incomes for natives, rising housing rents, and out migration from refugee exposed regions. Then, using a dynamic spatial general equilibrium model and incorporating endogenously evolving regional amenities, I explain dynamic migration choices of the natives and predict the evolution of economic outcomes under counterfactual policy scenarios.

2. Minimum Wages, VAT, and Export Market Participation: The Case of Mexico (Third Year Paper)

This study disentangles the effects of a minimum wage increase and a value added tax reduction on Mexico's export participation. Using a Difference-in-Differences design and firm-level microdata, I estimate the impact of this policy bundle on exports, focusing on the U.S.-Mexico trade. The paper highlights the interplay between labor costs and tax incentives in shaping international competitiveness.
